
From the Principal


Dear Parents Caregivers and Whānau,

Cross Country Training

We are continuing our whole school training for the school cross country. This is happening Monday to Friday each week. All children will need appropriate footwear to run in and older children can wear a change of clothes. If younger children can't tie shoelaces they will need sneakers with velcro.

In and Around School

Week 4 - Road Safety Week (20-24th May)

During next week at school we will be learning about different aspects of Road Safety and how to keep safe on the roads. We will be having visits from Constable Tino, who will be working with year 0-4 children on road safety, including crossing the road and travelling safely in a car. The year 5-6 children will be participating in cycle skills training sessions, including how to ride safely on the road. Year 5-6 children were given a notice about this today. The form needs to be filled out and returned to school before the sessions on Wednesday morning. All the information is on the link below and in the notice.

Information for Whānau Change of Clothes

Please don't wear any sports boots with sprigs (either plastic or metal) when playing sports on the field. This can cause injuries to children playing in bare feet.

Children need to be wearing our winter school uniform from the beginning of term 2.

Ordering has been set up on Kindo for all the sushi dates this term. You can order for as many weeks in advance as you like. Sushi orders close at 8.30am on the day of the delivery. You can also cancel a sushi order up until 8.30am on the day of the delivery.

Orders for Pizza Day on Tuesday 28 May are now open and close on Thursday 23 May at 6pm. Orders for Pizza Day will always close 5 days before the day of the delivery and cannot be cancelled after this time. We are unable to accommodate

pizza orders when the orders have closed so please be sure to order well in advance of this.

Moosies are also able to be ordered through Kindo and have been set up on Kindo for all of the Moosie dates this term. You can also order Moosies for as many weeks in advance as you like. Moosie orders close at 8.30am on the day of the orders. You can cancel a Moosie order up until 8.30am on the day of delivery.

If you have ordered a Moosie from Kindo, please remind your child they MUST line up outside Room 2 at lunchtime, after they are released from sitting/eating



time. Moosie monitors are not able to find children once lunch begins.
