

Sustainability Science in Action - Getting to Know Our Compost Worms *Really* Well...















Last Friday we had our first produce sale of the year. We raised \$48 from selling our fresh fruit and vegetables and worm tea fertiliser produced by our worm farms. The money will be put towards Garden Club projects and activities.

Absences, Late or Early Exits at School

If your child is not attending school please make sure you call the school office **before 9:30AM** 09 6204962, email <u>admin@goodshepherd.school.nz</u> or leave a message on the school absence voicemail with the reason, this is so we can code your child's absence to the Ministry of Education accordingly.

Your child is late if they arrive at school from 8:50 AM, every child arriving after the late bell will need to come into the office to sign in as they won't have been marked on the class roll taken in the morning.

Leaving school early? Remember to get an exit slip from the office. Please be aware that if you decide to do early pick up during school break times, that you will need to factor into your timeframe your search in the school grounds to find them.

Change of Clothes
