Information for Whānau Keeping Our School Healthy

Attendance & Illnesses With an increase of sickness around school at the moment, please keep your child at home if they are very unwell.



When to Keep Your Child at Home

At GSS we believe every school day matters, however it is essential to recognise that sending a sick child to school can have an impact on their health and the health of others. Here are some guidelines to help you decide when to keep your child at home:

• **Fever:** If your child has a fever of 37.8°C or higher, they should stay home until they are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.

- Vomiting or Diarrhoea: Children should stay home for at least 48 hours after the last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea.
- Persistent Cough or Difficulty Breathing: If your child has a severe cough or trouble breathing, it's best to consult with a healthcare provider before sending them to school.
- **Contagious Illness:** Your child should remain at home for the period advised by your healthcare provider.

As a parent or guardian we understand that your child's health and recovery is the main priority, if you believe that your child is needing extra time to recover from an illness please continue to listen to your parents' intuition, but **still** update the school office. We are currently experiencing an increase in student sickness at school. We are having to send an increasing number of children home who are or still feeling unwell.

Communicating Absences

If your child needs to stay home due to illness, please inform the school as soon as possible. This helps us keep track of health trends such as Covid, or respiratory viruses. Advising the school also ensures that your child's absence is properly recorded.

Overseas Holiday During School Term

Family holidays are fun and something to look forward to, however we want to remind families that holidays or taking time off for extracurricular activities (not organised by school) are not deemed by the Ministry to be acceptable reasons for being absent. Change of Clothes - On the Field

As the winter season sets in you will see that the field has become extra muddy and wet. Continue to

bring a change of clothes for children to play on the field. Children are still expected to arrive and leave school in their full school uniform. Once they are at school, they can change. Bare feet or different footwear (no school uniform or school shoes on the field) is allowed. Many children have sport style shoes as their school shoes, they are not allowed to wear these on the field.

Please don't wear any sports boots with sprigs (either plastic or metal) when playing sports on the field. This can cause injuries to children playing in bare feet.



Waste Free Lunches

Ordering has been set up on Kindo for all the sushi dates this term. You can order for as many weeks in advance as you like. Sushi orders close at 8.30am on the day of the delivery. You can also cancel a sushi order up until 8.30am on the day of the delivery.

Moosies are also able to be ordered through Kindo and have been set up on Kindo for all of the Moosie dates this term. You can also order Moosies for as many weeks in advance as you like. Moosie orders close at 8.30am on the day of the orders. You can cancel a Moosie order up until 8.30am on the day of delivery.

If you have ordered a Moosie from Kindo, please remind your child they MUST line up outside Room 2 at lunchtime, after they are released from sitting/eating time. Moosie monitors are not able to find children once lunch begins.
