School Trip to Maritime Museum

Immigration and Identity PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

Why do people migrate? What are the driving forces that influence people to leave?

Experience the journeys of immigrants from the past and get your sea legs in the 1841 rocking cabin. Beginning with the story of our first people, this Educator-led workshop will lead you on a journey through time to today's migrants. Together we will discover how people migrate and most importantly why. Students will reflect on their own whanau origins, their reasons for migrating, and their impact on the changing face of Aotearoa New Zealand. The workshop is complemented by a self-guided immigration trail that explores the Museum's taonga including Te Waka, an animated short film showing the Pacific migration of the early Polynesians. Students will work in small groups, led by their adult supervisors, to follow their own interests and learn

at their own pace. Students will also get to go sailing on a sailing ship with the instructors.

Cans for Christmas

In week 7 of our term - Friday 30 August until Friday 06 September, Good Shepherd School will be collecting food cans for our St Vincent De Paul Christmas drive. Last year we raised over 400 cans. Let's see if we can beat that number this year! Each classroom will have a box collecting food cans - your donations are much appreciated by this fantastic organisation.



Sustainability Learning at GSS

Following on from our interactive learning experience with the Tread Lightly Caravan in June, over Term 3 and 4, each class will be a part of four sustainability focussed sessions with Ms Chan. The key messages from the Tread Lightly Caravan were:

- Our actions and choices have an impact on our environment.
- The current rate and way in which we use resources (water, materials, energy) is not sustainable
- Small changes in the way we live will prevent pollution and protect our plants, animals and their habitats

Each class has had one sustainability session with Ms Chan so far. These have been based on some follow up activities from the Tread Lightly Educators, focusing on students learning about reducing their waste and having good recycling practices. We have taken this learning and thought about how we can do a better job of reducing waste and having good recycling practices at Good Shepherd School. Key Ideas included:

- Looking after our classroom resources so that they do not become damaged and need to go into landfill
- Using only what we need (eg limit use of paper towels and tissues to essential use)
- Bringing a waste free lunch to school
- Ensuring nothing goes into the landfill bin which could actually be recycled
- Ensuring nothing goes into the landfill bin which could go into the worm farm compost bins
- Ensuring any bottles/cans/containers/boxes have been cleaned before being put into the recycling bin
- Ensuring recycling is not contaminated with non recyclable items



Home-School Connection

If you are keen to reinforce this learning in the home, you could try playing this game at home with your child. They have done this in class already so you can test them on their knowledge or they can test you! Recycle Right Game. In addition to this, if you do not already collect soft plastics at home and take them to the soft plastics recycling bin at the

supermarket, this is something you may like to start doing with your child. This was something that was discussed at Tread Lightly to reduce landfill waste. We do not collect soft plastics at Good Shepherd because we ask that students' lunches are waste free.

Waste Free Lunches

We encourage you to continue with sending a waste free lunch to school with your child. This can be achieved by using a compartment lunchbox or reusable containers inside a lunchbox/lunch bag and removing any packaging from food items before placing it in the lunchbox. We ask children who do have any waste in their lunchbox (packaging or uneaten food) to bring it home to put into their home food waste / soft plastic recycling where possible unless we can accommodate it in our school worm farms or recycling bins

Absences from School for Overseas Trips

At this time of year we receive a number of requests for permission to take children out of school for family holidays and trips overseas. Although there are undoubtedly benefits and learning opportunities for children in these situations, there is also a very real impact on in-school teaching and learning. Please see guidelines below to clarify for parents and caregivers the impact of extended absences from school.

Good Shepherd School Uniform Expectations

Please pay special attention to your child's uniform and ensure they are wearing the correct uniform to school, particularly to school shoes, hair, and accessories.

Term 3 - Winter Uniform

Students wear winter uniforms. This includes black socks and black shoes.

A watch and gold or silver ear studs are the only jewellery permitted with the school uniform.

Religious & cultural taonga are allowed.

Sports Uniform: Compulsory for Years 4, 5 and 6.

Nail polish is not permitted on either fingers or toes. Makeup may not be worn. Long hair must be tied back. Hair accessories must be simple and either navy blue or black. If your child is wearing non-uniform items, please email the class teacher.

Attendance Dues and Financial Assistance

Financial assistance applications need to be underway by the 16th of September. These are available to assist families who have made an attempt to make payments but may need support with the payment of Attendance Dues for preference students attending both primary and secondary Catholic schools in Auckland Diocese. Ordering has been set up on Kindo for all the sushi dates this term. You can order for as many weeks in advance as you like. Sushi orders close at 8.30am on the day of the delivery. You can also cancel a sushi order up until 8.30am on the day of the delivery.

Moosies are also able to be ordered through Kindo and have been set up on Kindo for all of the Moosie dates this term. You can also order Moosies for as many weeks in advance as you like. Moosie orders close at 8.30am on the day of the orders. You can cancel a Moosie order up until 8.30am on the day of delivery.

If you have ordered a Moosie from Kindo, please remind your child they MUST line up outside Room 2 at lunchtime, after they are released from sitting/eating time. Moosie monitors are not able to find children once lunch begins.
