From the Principal

Kia ora e te whānau.

This week on November 1st we celebrate All Saints Day with Mass in our Parish Church at 9.30am. This is a time for us to remember those significant figures in the Catholic Church who have given their lives to positively influence our faith journey.

Saturday November 2nd is All Souls' Day. An opportunity for us to remember the faithfully departed. Two prayers you may want to use on this day of remembrance are the Our Father and the Creed.

You may have read in our latest Church newsletter...'In these two days we contemplate the reign of God in its fullness, and the church 'still on the journey'. The church 'already' - those saints with God in heavenly life, and those on the journey - The holy souls who we continue to accompany with our love and prayer. They remind us of our mortality and we remember that it is a good and holy thing to pray for the dead.

Children attending Mass this Friday 9.30am and Sunday are being encouraged to dress as their favourite Saint.

As term 4 commenced so has our preparations for our annual school Athletics Day. This year it will be held on Tuesday 12 November at Margaret Griffen Park. Whānau are very welcome to come along and support our tamariki. Children have been training hard as part of our weekly athletics rotation and learning new techniques and skills as they prepare for this event.

At our whole school assembly last Friday I asked the children to set a goal for the day. For some it may be better participation than previously, for others it could be setting a 'Personal Best' or achieving a placing. Whatever it is, I encourage them to challenge themselves. What will your child's goal be?

Finally, a reminder there will be a Teacher Only Day on the 11th of November. School will be closed for children as teachers continue their commitment to ongoing Professional Development. In this instance we will be working with expert facilitator Alana Madgwick on the topic of Oracy. This year we have seen a positive connection between developing oral language skills and our children's ability to achieve deeper levels of comprehension across the curriculum. This day will see a continuation of this valuable work.

Information for Whānau Attendance Dues

Moosie Magic!

We are trying to reduce waste at GSS, especially plastic waste! Very soon we will be trialling ice blocks which come in boxes without plastic wrappers. There are three flavours - **chocolate**, **tropical** and **feijoa**. The cost of the new ice blocks will be the same at **\$2**. Please help support us in our journey to become more sustainable.

Ice blocks are able to be ordered through Kindo and are set up for the term. You can also order ice blocks for as many weeks in advance as you like. Ice blocks orders close at 8.30am on the day of the orders. You can cancel an ice block order up until 8.30am on the day of delivery.

Orders are taken online via <u>Kindo</u>. Sushi orders close at 8.30am on Friday mornings. Pizza orders close at 6pm, 5 days prior to the pizza day. Once orders are closed, it is not possible to add an order. Sushi orders can be cancelled up to 8.30am on the day of the delivery but pizza orders can only be cancelled up until the orders close.

Thank you very much to the volunteers that are helping out with sushi and pizzas this term.

Moosies are also able to be ordered through Kindo and have been set up on Kindo for all of the Moosie dates this term. You can also order Moosies for as many weeks in advance as you like. Moosie orders close at 8.30am on the day of the orders. You can cancel a Moosie order up until 8.30am on the day of delivery.

If you have ordered a Moosie from Kindo, please remind your child they MUST line up outside Room 2 at lunchtime, after they are released from sitting/eating time. Moosie monitors are not able to find children once lunch begins.
