

#### Room 1

Our newest members of the GSS whānau have dived straight into their learning with an exciting inquiry about kitchen science! We have been discovering how food changes when it is heated and cooled. Here are some pictures of the fun we've been having making toast, jelly and popcorn.







#### Sustainability

Last week Room 4 enjoyed making bath salts using epsom salts along with some rose petals, lavender and sage collected from our school gardens. This tied in to previous work where we have learned about the importance of bees to our environment and ways that we can help sustain and improve the bee population. Room 8 children enjoyed making some herb bread using sage, parsley and leek from the school garden. This also tied in to previous learning about the importance of bees.

#### **Rustic Round Herb Bread**

- · 2 cups all purpose flour · 1 cup grated cheese
- · 1 tablespoon sugar 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- · 1/2 teaspoon salt · 1 tablespoon diced fresh herbs
- 50g cold butter
  1/2 cup natural yogurt
  1/2 cup milk

- · 1 large egg



#### **Directions**

- 1. In a large bowl, combine the first 7 ingredients. Cut in butter until mixture resembles fine crumbs.
- 2. In another bowl, whisk the egg, yogurt and milk. Stir into dry ingredients until just moistened.
- 3. Spoon into a 20cm round baking pan coated with cooking spray or lined with baking paper.
- 4. Bake at 200° for 20-25 minutes or until golden brown. Cool in pan on a wire rack. Cut into wedges













#### A Visit from an Artist

Room 8 was very fortunate to have a special art class last Friday run by local artist and former Good Shepherd parent, Gabrielle Gatt. Gabrielle had the children looking very carefully at and noticing details of the sunflowers she had brought in. She also asked the children to think about how art is a feeling and that we can think about how an artwork makes us feel and also how the subject matter (sunflowers) look like they might be feeling if they had emotions. A couple of other very powerful messages to our Room 8 artists were, draw or paint what you see, not what you think other people see, and your mistakes are what makes your artwork unique to you and make it beautiful.









## Samantha Charlton, Olympic Ambassador (Hockey)

Our tamariki were in the presence of Olympian and Commonwealth Games greatness when we hosted Samantha Charlton on Wednesday. Samantha has competed representing New Zealand more than 250 times including winning gold and bronze at Commonwealth Games and competing at three Olympics. What an inspiration!

Dues are now urgently required as final 2024 payments will be made to the Catholic Diocese next week. #### Crosses

#### Nice Blocks!

Thank you for your support in our journey to become more sustainable. The tamariki are enjoying their new plastic-free ice blocks!

Ice blocks are able to be ordered through Kindo and are set up for the term. The cost of the new ice blocks is still **\$2.** 



You can order ice blocks for as many weeks in advance as you like. Ice blocks orders close at 8.30am on the day of the orders. You can cancel an ice block order up until 8.30am on the day of delivery

#### Sushi. Pizzas

Sushi/pizza will be available on the following dates this term:

Orders are taken online via <u>Kindo</u>. Sushi orders close at 8.30am on Friday mornings. Pizza orders close at 6pm, 5 days prior to the pizza day. Once orders are closed, it is not possible to add an order. Sushi orders can be cancelled up to 8.30am on the day of the delivery but pizza orders can only be cancelled up until the orders close.

Thank you very much to the volunteers that are helping out with sushi and pizzas this term.

Moosies are also able to be ordered through Kindo and have been set up on Kindo for all of the Moosie dates this term. You can also order Moosies for as many weeks in advance as you like. Moosie orders close at 8.30am on the day of the orders. You can cancel a Moosie order up until 8.30am on the day of delivery.

If you have ordered a Moosie from Kindo, please remind your child they MUST line up outside Room 2 at lunchtime, after they are released from sitting/eating time. Moosie monitors are not able to find children once lunch begins.
