## From the Principal

### Kia ora e te whānau,

Last week, we gathered as a school community to celebrate Ash Wednesday Mass with Father Martin, marking the beginning of Lent. In his latest letter to the Parish, he reminded us of three key Lenten practices:

- **Prayer** A special time to connect with God.
- **Conversion** Making small sacrifices each day as we recognise our need for change.
- Charity As Saint John Paul II beautifully described, charity is "rooted in the deepest part of the human heart."

During Lent, we see the colour purple around our church, symbolising penance and reflection. This is a

time for us all to grow spiritually and prepare for the Paschal mystery.

Earlier this week, our tamariki took part in a Fire Drill. They did an amazing job moving quickly and calmly to our assembly point, where we completed a roll call—ka pai, tamariki! Fire drills are an important part of keeping everyone safe, and it was great to see our students respond so well.

A big thank you to Matua Tainui, who has generously volunteered his time to offer Te Reo Māori classes after school. If you missed the first session, don't worry—there's another one coming up this Monday in Room 5. Matua Tainui always makes learning fun, so why not come along and learn alongside your child?

It has also been fantastic to see our classes making the most of the school pool. We were fortunate to have educators from Drowning Prevention Auckland visit recently, helping our tamariki build confidence and learn essential water safety skills. A huge thank you to them for their support!

Lastly, a friendly reminder to please drive carefully during drop-off and pick-up times, including OSCA times. Some parents have shared concerns about cars moving too quickly in these busy periods. Let's all work together to keep our tamariki safe by slowing down and staying alert around the school grounds.


### **Waste Free Lunches at GSS**

How to pack a waste free lunch box


### Information for Whānau
